ARTICLES

Read this sentence from the story.

A crow laid two eggs in her nest built high up on a branch of a tree. After sitting on the eggs for a couple of days, she grew weary.

The words *a* and *the* are called articles. They are used before nouns, though not always immediately before them.

There are three articles in English: *a*, *an* and *the*.

A and *an* are used with singular countable nouns. We do not use them with plural or uncountable nouns.

a man an apple

A is used before words that begin with a consonant sound.

a cat a book

An is used before words that begin with a vowel sound.

an elephant an officer



Language Tip

Some words can be tricky.

Honest begins with the vowel sound *o* because *h* in it is silent.

an honest person ✓ **a** honest person ✗

Uniform begins with the consonant sound *yoo*.

a uniform ✓ **an** uniform ✗

This is the watch that I got on my birthday.

- when we talk about someone or something that is one of a kind, such as names of rivers, oceans, mountain ranges, famous monuments, some countries and so on
the sun, the moon, the earth, the Ganga, the Indian Ocean, the Himalayas, the Golden Temple, the United States of America

- when we talk about something that was mentioned earlier

There was a bench nearby. Two people were sitting on the bench.
