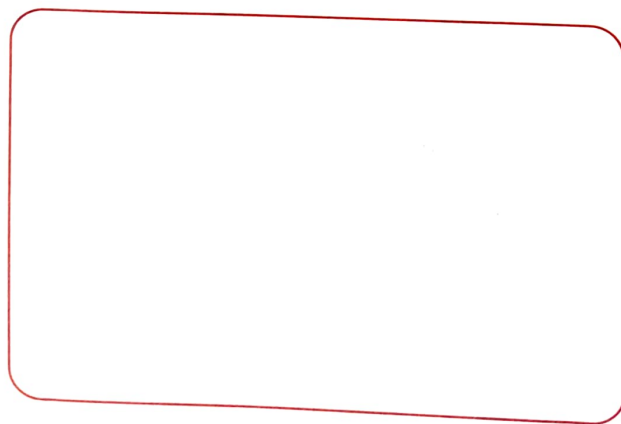

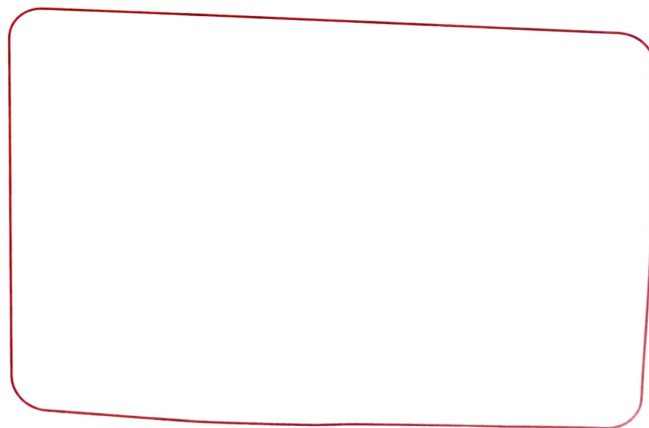

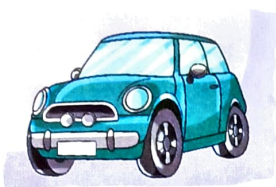

Comparison

We add **-er** to the adjective to compare **two things** or **people** and **-est** to the adjective to compare **more than two things** or **people**.



A bus is **longer** than a car, but a train is the **longest** of the three.
