The background color of a text box is transparent by default in ms paint.

On selecting the Transparent option the background colour of the text box becomes transparent the text colour will be the same in the text box as is selected in colour box.

2 select the transparent option from the background group.

- We use **the** before a noun when we have spoken about it earlier.

I had **a** pen. (any pen)

I gave **the** pen to my friend. (the pen that I had)

- The** is used before nouns if the context specifies what we are talking about. There are cases where the speaker and the learner already know the thing that is being talked about.

I went to **the** bank yesterday. (the bank in which the speaker has an account)

Firaaq closed **the** window and pulled down **the** blinds. (the window in his room and the blinds of the window)

- Generally, we do not use an article with proper nouns (names of people and places). However, we use **the** with some proper nouns.

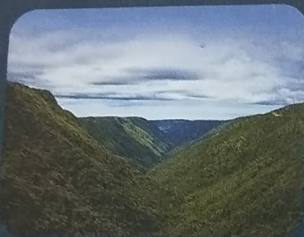
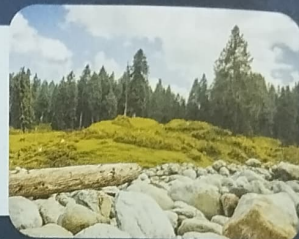
08 Hill Stations of India

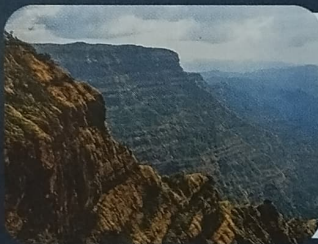


2. Known as the 'Scotland of the East', Shillong is a popular hill station in northeast India. It is known for its natural beauty and culture.

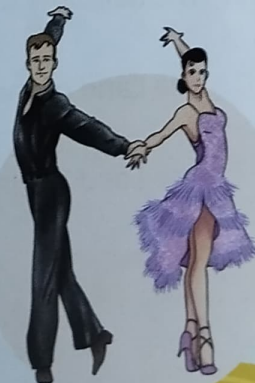


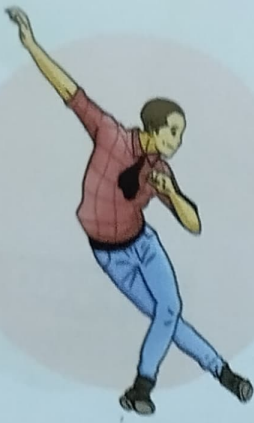

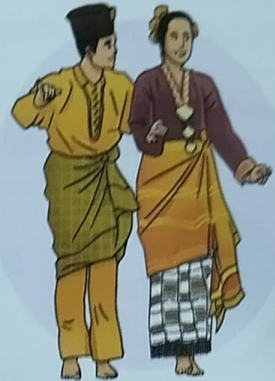
