Word Corner

Prefixes and Suffixes

In the lesson did you notice the word *unable*? It is the opposite of the word *able* and is formed by adding *un-* to it. *Un-* is a prefix. A prefix is a group of letters which is added at the beginning of a word to make a new word.

Other examples of prefix are: *dis-*, *im-*, *in-*

- appear ~ *dis*appear
- agree ~ *dis*agree
- pure ~ *im*pure
- possible ~ *im*possible
- direct ~ *in*direct
- complete ~ *in*complete

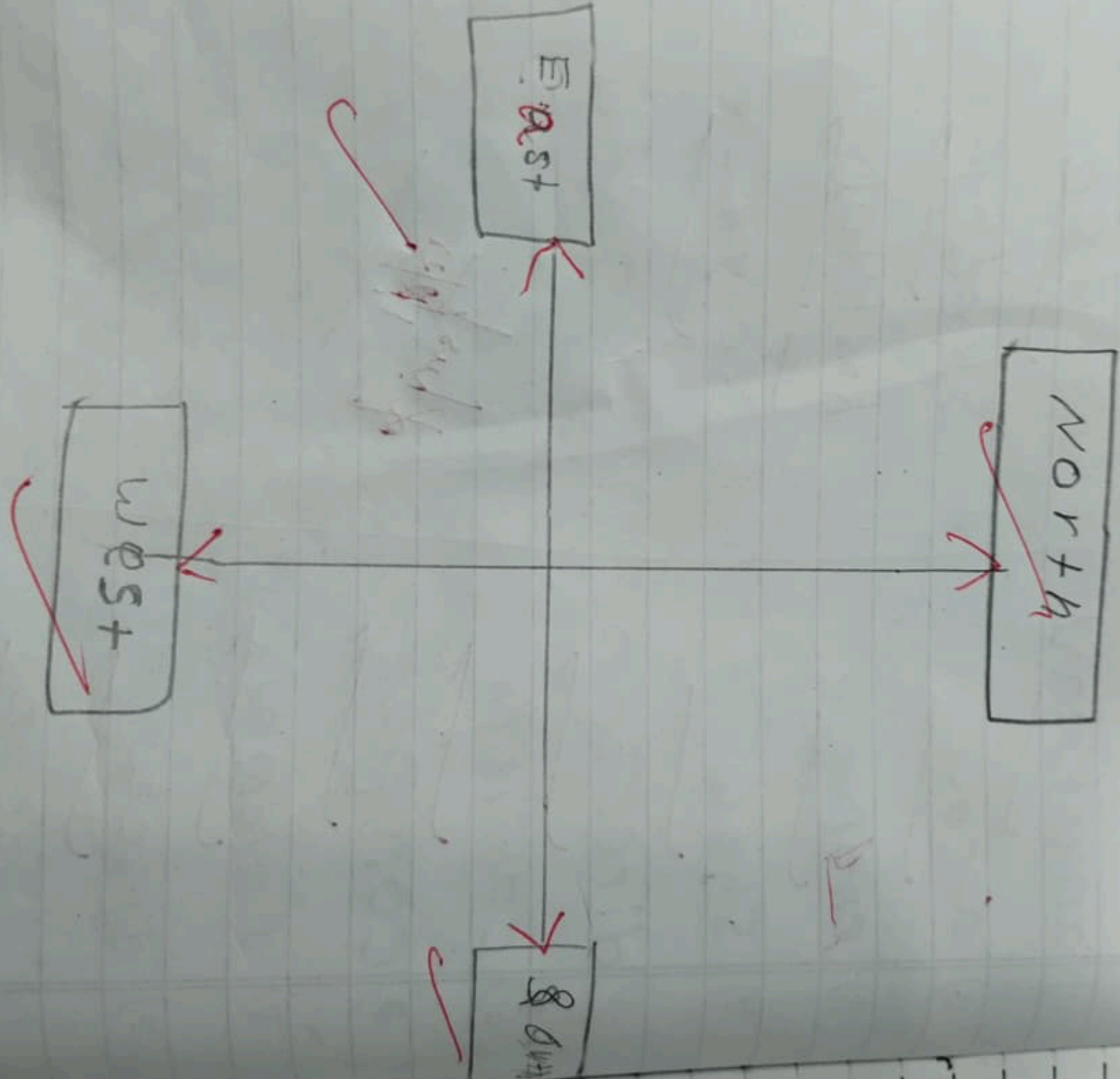
